





Sept. 11, 1814
British sailed toward Baltimore with a planned land attack and the siege of Fort M'Henry.

Sept. 12, 1814
The British army of almost 5,000 soldiers and sailors landed at North Point.

Sept. 12, 1814
Gen. Ross led the British light infantry up North Point Rd. towards Baltimore.

Sept. 12, 1814
British Gen. Ross is killed in a skirmish at Godly Woods.

Sept. 13, 1814
British fleet ships advanced up the Patuxent River and positioned to attack Ft M'Henry.

Sept. 13-14, 1814
After over 25 hours British Admiral Cochrane called off the bombardment of Fort M'Henry.

Sept. 13, 1814
British and American troops clash at North Point, but the American forces eventually retreat.

Sept. 14, 1814
The British position to attack Hampstead Hill, but retreat due to overwhelming American numbers.

Sept. 14, 1814
The British try to flank the fort but are discovered by flotilla men and are forced to retreat.
